The Louisiana Society Of Horticultural Research (LSHR) was established in 1954. It supports the advancement of research and education in the field of horticulture, most typically ornamentals. The focus of all applications must be on plants with a primarily ornamental value with focus on plants suitable to culture in the Gulf of Mexico Coastal Region. Applications should look to applied research not basic research. Funding is available for graduate or post-graduate level research in the amount of \$3,000 to \$5,000, depending on the request of the applicant. The enclosed guidelines and application narrative indicate the requirements.

PROPOSALS ARE REVIEWED ANNUALLY, AT THE LSHR SPRING BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING.

Funding levels are determined based on the scope of the project (\$3,000 - \$5,000). All proposals must be received by March 6, 2024 for consideration by the Board. The proposal is not to exceed three typed pages: Cover page, Research Description and Budget. Addenda should include a brief resume/biography of the Principle Investigator and if appropriate other related information.

A Final Report is due 10 days after the end of the funding period and must have an introductory summary describing the project, appropriate research methodology, and conclusions. The body of the report may not exceed 3 pages. Additionally, 2-10 color photographs must be included. LSHR reserves the right to publish the final report and photographs of the final report in its official newsletter, The Compost Pile; it further reserves to publish reprints. The author of this report agrees to these terms in accepting this funding.

RESEARCH PROPOSAL MUST CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION

1. COVER PAGE | PAGE 1

Title of project; applicant's name, land address, phone number and email address; personal information/qualifications; exact name and address of the individual and/or institution to which grant funding check is to be made payable. Grant amount requested must be shown; signature and date.

2. DESCRIPTION OF RESEARCH AND ESTIMATED DATE OF PROJECT | PAGE 2

Describe the project. The proposal description should be brief and concise in clear, lively language. All proposals must begin with a paragraph, not exceeding 100 words which summarizes the grant request as follows: who, what, why, when and where of the project and how funding will support research or plant collecting (e.g. a trip) and summarizing the intended use of funds. Be sure to include from whom you will receive other funding if this project is in conjunction with another grant(s), as we expect individuals to seek other funding sources; LSHR does not expect to provide full funding for most plant collecting trips.

3. BUDGET | PAGE 3

Specific items should be included as appropriate. All items in the budget must have a narrative justification included. A summary of all budget costs where funds will be spent are to be included showing other or matching funds.
